ENVIRONMENTAL TOXICOLOGY OF PESTICIDE INTERACTION

In vitro and *In vivo* studies were conducted to determine the effect of pre-exposure to organochlorine pesticide on the toxicity of organophosphate pesticides in rodents. Interactions between these pesticides were also studied.
